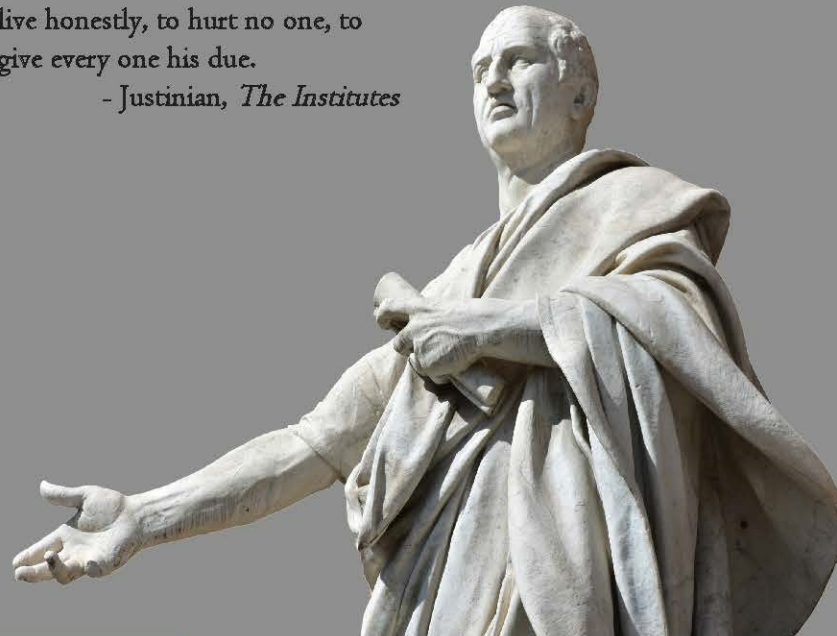

He is also Peter and Kirstin Bedford Senior Fellow at the Hoover Institution and James Parker Hall Distinguished Service Professor of Law Emeritus and a senior lecturer at the University of Chicago.
